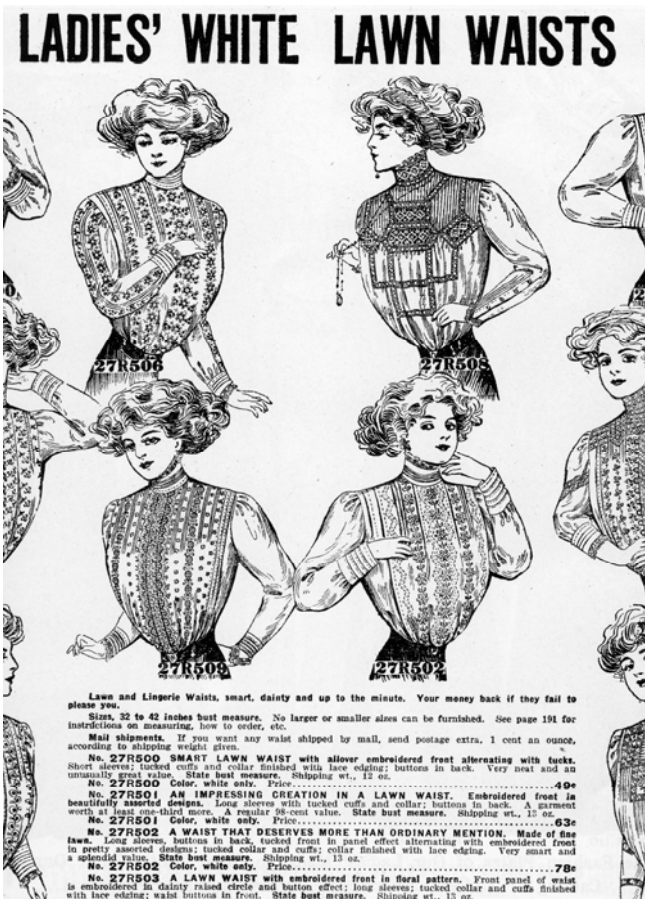
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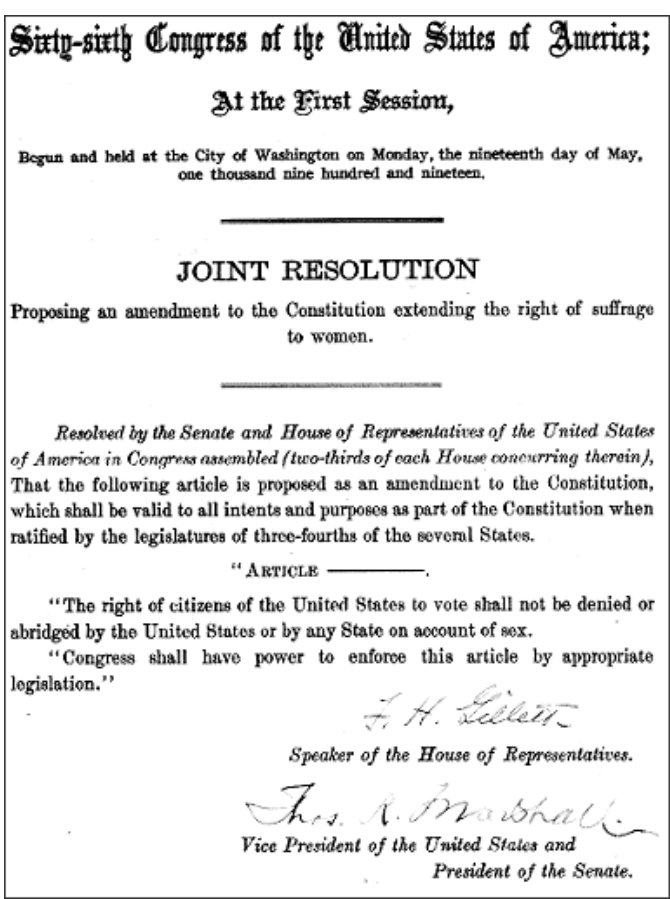

1. How did new technology change the way Americans lived and worked?

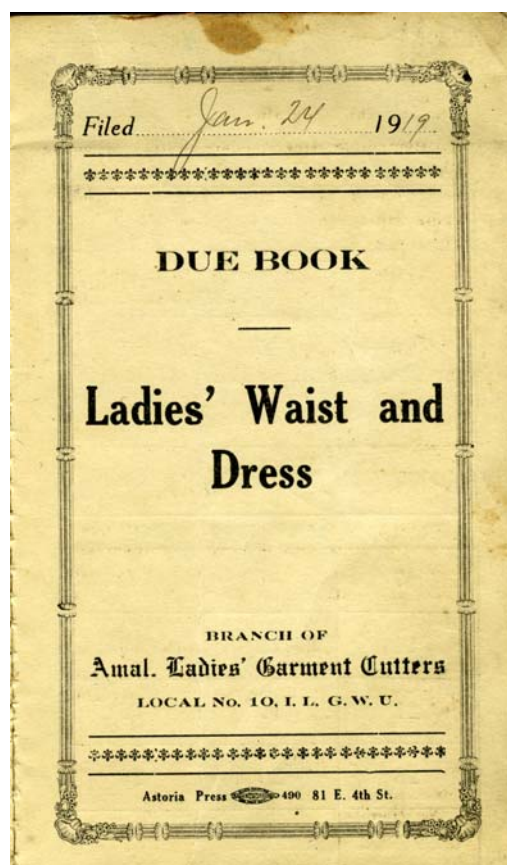
2. How were people's lives in the period from 1880-1914 different from the way we live today?
